



Echidna

Tachyglossus aculeatus

Echidnas are found in forests and woodlands, hiding under vegetation, roots or piles of debris.

Echidnas are good swimmers and often seek water to bathe themselves.

The Echidna feeds by tearing open soft logs and using its long, sticky tongue to collect prey such as ants and termites.

A baby Echidna is called a puggle.
