



River Red Gum

Eucalyptus camaldulensis

The River Red Gum, which is found along many inland watercourses, can grow up to 45metres in height and live for 500 to 1000 years.

It provides important hollows, which a range of different animals live in.

Flooding is important for the species to grow and regenerate, however permanent flooding can result in tree death.

River Red Gums are culturally important as they were often used to make canoes and shields.
