



Eastern Long-necked Turtle

Chelodina longicollis

The Eastern Long-necked Turtle lives in freshwater environments across eastern Australia.

It can travel large distances between bodies of freshwater and is often seen on roadways.

The Eastern Long-necked Turtle can eject a liquid from its 'armpits' and groin when handled or disturbed.

The Eastern Long-necked Turtle's shell grows to around 25cm in length and feeds on fish, tadpoles, frogs and crayfish.
