


# DIY Habitat Tripod

# #waterfoodshelter

Small birds like Fairy-wrens *Malurus sp.* and Red-browed Finch *Neochmia temporalis* need places to feed and breed where they are safe from larger birds and cats.


Fairy-wrens feed on insects on the ground or in small bushes. A small dome-shaped nest is well-hidden and placed close to the ground, often in grass tussocks.

Red-browed Finches feed on insects and seeds on the ground. A relatively large dome-shaped nest made of twigs and grass stems and placed 1 to 2 metres above ground in a dense shrub.




### **Construction:**

## Step 1: Mark cuts




Step 2: Use handsaw to cut angles



**Step 3: Check fit of tripod legs** 


Once all legs are cut, check they mate together correctly.



### Step 3: Fix join with bolts or fencing wire

This tripod is for a backyard installation and will be approximately 1.5m high so we used simple galvanised brackets from Bunnings cut to 100mm.

Note that brackets will need to be bent to approximately 120° to align with the legs.





Drill brackets to take bolts.

Drill and bolt bracket to first leg. Mark drill hole on second leg using bracket as guide. Dill and bolt second leg then repeat for third leg.

### **Step 4: Paint tripod legs**

Disassemble tripod for painting with a non-toxic product like Lanotec Timber Seal or Linseed Oil. Pay particular attention to cut sections.

## Step 5: Installation:

Install legs in holes 300 to 500mm deep and backfill with tamped down soil. Do not use concrete.






#### **Step 5: Planting for Food and Shelter**

#### Planting for:

- Food: A mix of nectar and insect attracting vines and wildflowers will feed birds like Eastern Spinebills and Fairy-wren. Native grasses will provide food for seed eating birds like Red-browed Finches and Pale-headed Rosellas.
- Shelter: Vines growing over tripod and shrubs filling the centre will create safe habitat for nesting.
