



Number of Participants in Connecting Community Events/Activites











Number of Strategies/Plans or events

What could be improved?

- Funding
- More community buy-in
- Clearer roles and responsibilities of partner organisations
- Ground staff/labour not relying on volunteers for education sessions
- Strategic level cooperation
- Partnership with tertiary institutions
- More path connections
- Partnerships could be better communicated
- Celebration of Shepp and Mooroopna as River towns
- Students involved in monitoring and recording
- Program extended out of the urban environment (ideally catchment wide)
- Better advertising of events
