NATURE ART: MAKE A DREAMCATCHER

With lots of people working in their gardens right now, see what you can make with the cut offs and bits and pieces you find on the ground.

And create a beautiful dream catcher.

You can use some pieces of wool, leaves, feathers, gumnuts and anything else that tickles your imagination.



What You Need

- Preferably some bendy vine or wood, or some sticks you can tie together
- String, wool, long thin strips of fabric
- Leaves, feathers, gumnuts, shells etc.
- Time and imagination



Instructions

- 1. Bend the piece of vine or bendy wood, in to a circle or a tie a couple of sticks together to make the frame.
- 2. Get a piece of string and attach i a loop to what you want to be the top of the frame. Tie the rest of the string evenly spaced out to the frame. Make sure you leave a bit of slack.
- 3. Keep weaving the string around by looping it through the last round of loops until you get to the centre. You can use different colours along the way.
- 4. You can tie something in the centre, add braids or strings to the bottom and tie leaves or feathers to them, put beads in or gumnuts. The sky is the limit!
